Special Worship later this month

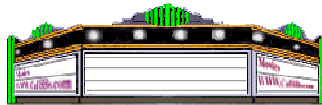

Why a Mission Statement?

This Sunday, I'll be sharing and explaining the purposes of a mission statement and why your Vision/Planning team proposes this particular statement to guide the dynamisms of our church life today...

MHBC: A loving community empowered by Christ to serve His purposes and the needs of others

Sometimes the purpose of a group or organization is easily gleaned from its name or title. Sometimes not. – For instance, the name COLT doesn't tell you that it is a telecommunications company, while First National Bank leaves no doubt as to its

purpose and business. Given the fact that there are tens of thousands of churches that go by the name Baptist, what in the world does Mount Hermon Baptist Church try to be and do?

At their best, mission statements are brief, memorable, and accurate. That's how you should judge the proposed mission statement. Does it encapsulate what we are, or what we can be, or what we want to be? Also, useful mission statements guide the process when they help us know why we exist and where we are going.

You can't improve on the Great Commission Jesus gave us in Matthew 28, but we can translate that mission into 21st century context and language, as this mission statement seeks to do. But just have a motto can result in mere sloganism, and who needs that? Not us.

Let's take this Sunday to consider our God-given mission more closely together.
